Fall Transitions at Canyon Granada

Fall brings welcome changes to Canyon Granada. Temperatures are moderating after a relatively mild summer. Our landscape is coming back to life, and our contractor is preparing to seed our lawn areas with Winter rye. This should produce beautiful, green grass for the Winter season.

Speaking of grass, our landscape committee has been working hard to comply with State of California and City of Palm Springs regulations for multi-family developments to reduce water usage through removal of grass. Our HOA Board has approved funds to plant new trees and shrubs in place of turf as a way of removing grass and increasing our canopy cover to get ahead of coming regulations. This is in line with the knowledge that full compliance could cost upwards of \$200K, and a phased-in approach will allow Canyon Granada to more prudently budget for this expense without further impact to monthly HOA dues. If you've been on the property recently, you will note that Palms have been planted along our main entry road. When mature, these plants will provide a beautiful avenue of shade producing greenery.



Annual tree trimming has commenced. This year our trees will be reduced in overall size, while last year they were only thinned. The treatment of our citrus trees this past Winter appears to have been successful. As you may recall, we were required to strip our trees of all fruit when we determined they had become infested with aphids.

With much gratitude for his hard work, Canyon Granada bid farewell to our head gardener, Martine. Our new gardener is Lander. He is 25 years old, married with a daughter, and has worked for our contractor for three years. Please introduce yourself to Lander when you see him working on our property and welcome him to Canyon Granada.

Projects

Storage Doors: We continue to experience delays with the replacement of our storage doors. Canyon Granada received a bid for this project, which was much higher than anticipated or budgeted. We are pursuing another, less costly approach to repair, replace, and make these units more secure. In the meantime, residents should be cautious about storing valuables in storage closets as break-ins could still happen.

Flooring Committee: The Flooring Committee submitted a report to the HOA Board, recommending a standard for flooring in main living areas of upstairs units. The Board is listening to residents and reviewing upstairs units that may have installed hard surface flooring that is not in compliance with our CC&R's and flooring standards.

Rats: We had problems with an infestation of rats in the 300 building. After extensive work to eliminate these vermin, we can happily report that it appears there is no more rodent activity. Canyon Granada is moving forward with securing a new pest control contractor.

Stairs and Landings: All Canyon Granada stairs and landings have now been repaired, recoated, and resealed. This project was a significant expense to Canyon Granada. During the inspection and maintenance, the contractor determined that some stairs were so damaged they had to be completely replaced. In the future, if owners see degradation of stairs or landings, please report it to management as soon as possible so that repairs can be made before structural damage occurs.
